

Bluebell - *Hyacinthoides non-scripta*



Description

Bluebells begin to emerge in early spring as tufts of narrow, blunt tipped, hairless leaves 20-40cm long. Blue-violet flowers with slightly curled, upturned tips, droop one-sided from the stalk.

The plant is found in dry to moist soils, mildly basic to mildly acidic. Bluebells are typically found in woodland (esp. ancient NVC W8-11) where it can cover large areas of the forest floor.
