- Show the class pictures of land art created by famous artists.
- In groups, discuss what they like about the art and how it has been made.

Forest Art



- Spend some time carefully looking at some trees, noticing the shapes and textures.
- In groups, hunt for natural materials on the forest floor and use these to make artwork to represent their favourite tree.
- Think of a title for their art.
- As a class, view each group's piece of artwork as a 'land art gallery tour' and discuss:
 - What materials did they use to make it?
 - What do they all like about this art?
- Take photos of each piece of art to display back in the classroom.
