Age: 11 - 14 year olds () Minimum time needed: 2 hours

Curriculum links:

Art

- Use a range of techniques to record observations in sketchbooks, journals and other media as a basis for exploring their ideas.
- Use a range of techniques and media, including painting. Increase their proficiency in the handling of different materials.

Study and sketch different leaves collected from a woodland or forest, to inspire a piece of artwork that reflect how students feel about nature.





- · Sketchbooks and white card
- Pencils
- Camera





Get Set

- Explore the forest, look at how light falls on leaves, and find different colours and textures.
- Collect fallen leaves or take photos of leaves that are still attached to use for inspiration in the classroom.
- If it is sunny, hold white card on the underneath of a leaf to capture a leaf shadow, draw around this.



For Teachers



Go

In groups, look for leaves on the forest floor, choosing four or five different shaped leaves.



Ask:

- How did they feel walking around the forest?
- What did they notice?
- Can you explain why they chose certain leaves to bring back or photograph?
- How do these leaves differ?

Sketch some of their finds using a range of different media.



Ask:

Which media do they think are most suitable for representing their chosen leaves and why?

Use the sketches to inspire a piece of artwork to reflect how they feel about nature using their chosen medium.







Go Beyond

Research the work of famous artists inspired by nature. How do they think they felt about nature?
